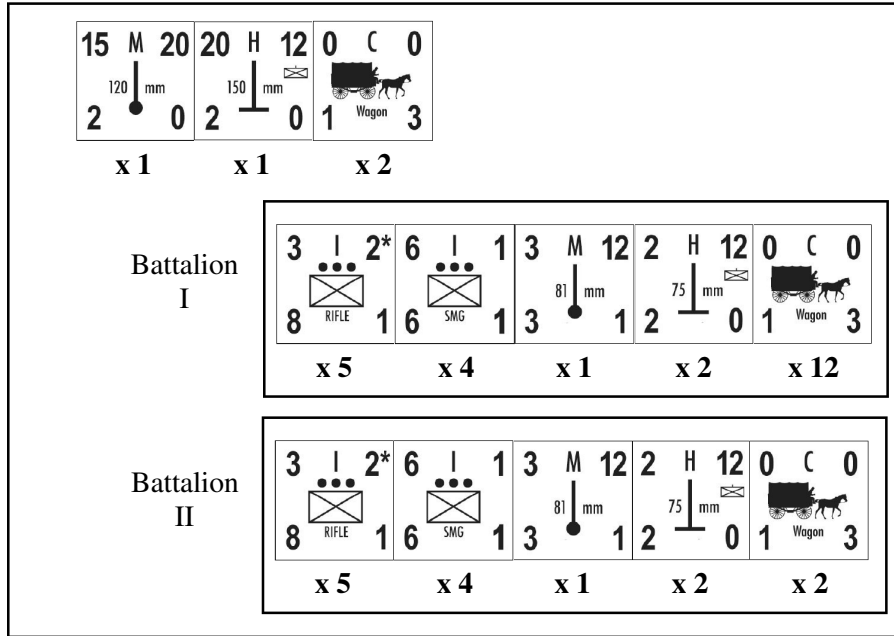




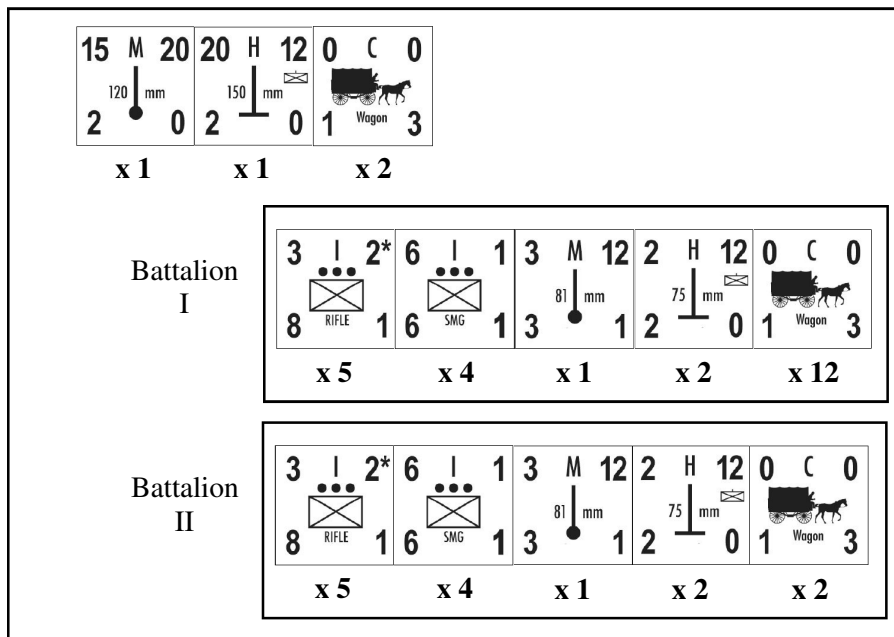

The 167th Volksgrenadier Division was a latecomer to the Ardennes Offensive. It was released from OKW Reserve on December 22 and did not arrive near Bastogne until December 28. The 167th was combined with the battered remains of the 1st SS Panzer and placed into XXXIX Korps, with orders from Hitler himself to take Bastogne "at all costs". The attack against the reinforced town was ineffective and the 167th began a slow retreat back to Germany.
